- 3. **Highlight the Jubilee Indulgence** (granted to participants; a beautiful teaching moment for young and old alike).

This World Day is **not just one day**—it's an invitation to build habits of gratitude all year. Let us honor St. Joachim and St. Anne, Grandparents of Jesus, by creating traditions that teach children to cherish their elders' wisdom and sacrifice.

### World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly 2025 Theme: "Blessed are those who have not lost hope"

#### Origins of the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly

In 2021, Pope Francis—responding to the prayers and petitions of the **Catholic Grandparents Association (CGA)** and the promptings of the Holy Spirit—established the **World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly**, to be celebrated annually on the Sunday closest to the feast of Saints Joachim and Anne (July 26), the parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Grandparents of Jesus. In 2025, this day will be observed on **Sunday, 27 July**, a moment for the entire Church to honor the vocation of Grandparents and the Elderly as pillars of faith, hope, and love.

For **25 years**, the Catholic Grandparents Association (CGA) has been at the forefront of efforts to awaken the world to the sacred calling of Grandparents and their irreplaceable role in the family, the Church, and society. In 2017, the CGA began a prayerful campaign—rooted in years of quiet perseverance—to propose the creation of this World Day to the Holy See. We rejoice that this initiative, born of the Holy Spirit and nurtured by the fidelity of countless Grandparents, was embraced by Pope Francis in 2021 as a gift for the universal Church. Today, this World Day stands as a testament to the Lord's faithfulness and a summons to cherish the wisdom and witness of older generations.

The theme for 2025, "Blessed Are Those Who Have Not Lost Hope" (cf. Sir 14:2), honors the steadfast trust in God that Grandparents and the Elderly embody—often amid trials or loneliness. Their lives proclaim that hope in Christ is never in vain, and their prayers and sacrifices quietly sustain the Church's mission. The Church needs Grandparents, and Grandparents need the Church.

#### A Day of Prayer and Grace

On this day, Grandparents and the Elderly are invited to unite with the Holy Father's intentions, offering their joys and sufferings for their families and the world. As a spiritual gift, the Apostolic Penitentiary grants a **plenary indulgence** (under the usual conditions) to those who participate in the World Day celebrations (see enclosed details). This World Day is a **fruit of the Church's growing recognition** of what the CGA has long proclaimed: Grandparents are not merely a "past" to remember, but a **living gift** and essential witnesses to the future of faith.

- - Establish a Phone Tree for prayer and outreach

#### **Ongoing Ministry and Community Life Throughout the Year**

- Create a Parish Ministry for Grandparents
- Feature Grandparent stories and photos in bulletins or slideshows
- Highlight the vocation of Grandparents in the bulletin
- · Organize intergenerational activities with teens and youth
- - Recognize special Grandparents at the Mass: oldest, most grandchildren, longest married, etc.
- Host a parish 'Retreat for Grandparents and the Elderly'
- Host intergenerational Tea/Coffee hour after Mass
- Photo Booth for Grandparents and Elderly with grandchildren / children

#### <u>Timeline for Diocesan, Parish, and Family Celebrations</u>

Adapt timing to suit your Diocese, Parish or home context

#### 6 months to 3 weeks ahead: — "Planting the Seeds of Hope"

- Share the World Day theme with your parish staff: "Blessed are those who have not lost hope" (Sir 14:2).
- Print and display CGA posters and prayer cards.
- Include an announcement in your weekly parish bulletin or e-newsletter.
- Begin promoting the Plenary Indulgence offered for participation in World Day activities.
- Invite families to share photos of their Grandparents for a bulletin collage or display board.
- At Masses, announce the coming celebration and encourage families to mark their calendars.
- Invite Key Leaders
  - Parish priests, coordinators, and lay elders gather to prayerfully begin local planning. Include intergenerational leaders in brainstorming.
  - Pastoral Reflection Prompt (for homily/team prayer):
  - "How does our parish currently uplift the elderly? Are there elders among us silently carrying faith through suffering?"

#### 3 months to 2 weeks ahead: — "Tending the Garden of Generations"

- Organize a family storytelling event or intergenerational rosary night.
  - Hold a brief gathering in parish halls for elders to share short "moments of hope."
- Encourage children to write short "Thank you" letters or drawings for their Grandparents.
- Distribute the "Conversation Starters" handout for Grandparents and grandchildren.
- Begin the 9-day CGA Novena to St. Joachim and St. Anne in daily parish liturgies or online.
- Invite school or youth groups to create art or essays honoring Grandparents.
- Schedule a home blessing or anointing for elderly parishioners who are homebound.
- Begin a Parish Exhibit: "Faces of Hope"—Photos of parish elders with quotes.
- Offer a special blessing for Grandparents and elderly at Mass.
- Light a ceremonial candle during liturgy to symbolize intergenerational hope.
- Encourage families to create, and gift, intergenerational spiritual bouquets for vocations.
- Reminders via parish bulletin about special Mass on the 27 July.
- Home Visit Ministry Begins
  - Parish teams and youth bring the Pope's message, flowers, and prayer cards to homebound and elderly members.

#### 2 months to 1 week ahead: — "Harvesting Joy and Honor"

- Prepare a dedicated space near the altar for families to light candles before or after Mass.
- If possible, display a "Grandparents Garden"—a memory board or floral arrangement.
- Encourage families to visit nursing homes or elderly parishioners with cards from children and caregivers.
- Prepare readers and lectors for any intercessions or readings honoring the elderly.
- Celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving in honor of Grandparents and the Elderly.
- Offer the Plenary Indulgence conditions clearly before Mass begins.
- Encourage families to light a candle at home and pray: "Lord, bless those who taught us to hope in You."
- End with a prayer to St. Joachim & St. Anne, patrons of all Grandparents.




#### **Pope Benedict XVI's Prayer for Grandparents**

#### Written at the request of the CGA in 2008.

that they may pass on to future generations the fruits
of their mature human and spiritual experience.

Lord Jesus,
help families and society
to value the presence and role of Grandparents.
May they never be ignored or excluded,
but always encounter respect and love.
Help them to live serenely and to feel welcomed
in all the years of life which you give them.
Mary, Mother of all the living,
keep Grandparents constantly in your care,
accompany them on their earthly pilgrimage,
and by your prayers, grant that all families
may one day be reunited in our heavenly homeland,
where you await all humanity
for the great embrace of life without end. Amen!

#### **CGA Resources Overview and Suggestions**

#### 1. Newsletter / Bulletin Insert (click here)

• A short article to include in parish bulletins or newsletters

#### 2. Plenary Indulgence Information (click here)

- Explains how Catholics can obtain a Plenary Indulgence and Jubilee Indulgence on World Day
  - Use Ideas & Suggestions:
    - Announce at Masses leading up to July 27
    - Include a printed summary in newsletters, bulletins or displayed in Parish Narthex

#### 3. Posters / Flyers - Light A Candle, Plant a Garden, Plant a Tree (click here)

- Visual materials to promote the World Day and CGA's message
  - Use Ideas & Suggestions:
    - Display in parish entrances, schools, and Catholic gift shops
    - Use in newsletters, websites, and social media graphics
    - Send home with school children to engage families

#### 4. CGA World Day Novena (click here)

- A 9-day prayer from July 18–26 focusing on various intentions related to Grandparents, families, and the Church
  - Use Ideas & Suggestions:
    - Incorporate into daily Mass, Rosary, or Holy Hour
    - Email one intention per day to the parish email list
    - Invite families to pray the Novena together at home

#### 5. Conversation Starters for Grandparents and Grandchildren (click here)

- Double-sided prompts—questions Grandparents can ask grandchildren, and vice versa
  - Use Ideas & Suggestions:
    - Print and distribute during school religion classes or parish family events
    - Include with "Act of Love" cards or at intergenerational events
    - Set out on tables during parish teas, coffee hours, or family meals

#### 6. Act of Love Card / Prayer Card (click here)

- A keepsake card for children to write promises or notes to their Grandparents
  - Use Ideas & Suggestions:
    - Distribute during Mass on July 27, especially by children.
    - Share in Catholic schools, Religious classes, and Vacation Bible School with a short activity
    - Include in family mailers with instructions to return them to a Grandparent or Elderly friend

#### 7. Peace Offering Card (click here)

- A simple prayerful card to bring peace between generations.
  - Use Suggestions:
    - Offer during reconciliation services or healing liturgies
    - Use in family therapy or parish counseling contexts
    - Distribute to families experiencing division or seeking reconciliation
    - Encourages children to make the first move towards Peace

#### 8. Grandparent's Blessing Card (click here)

- Prayer and Scripture for Grandparents to share with family.
  - Use Suggestions:
    - Distribute after the special blessing at Mass
    - Include in parish welcome packets for new families with older members
    - Display during home visits or elder care outreach

#### 9. Vocations Prayer Card (click here)

- A prayer card for seminarians, religious vocations, and of the Church (Priests, Nuns, Deacons, and lay faithful) inviting children and grandchildren to discern their own calling.
  - Use Suggestions:
    - Distribute at CGA gatherings, vocation fairs, or parish events
    - Share in Sunday bulletins or parish mailings, especially during Vocations Awareness Week
    - Use in schools or religious education settings to spark conversation about vocation
    - Leave in church vestibules or adoration chapels for private prayer

#### 10. Vocations Spiritual Bouquet Card (click here)

- A spiritual bouquet card for Grandparents, families, and grandchildren to offer prayers of gratitude for Priests, Deacons, and religious—and to nurture hope for future vocations.
  - Use Suggestions:
    - Grandparents, Parents, children, and grandchildren can each contribute their own intentions (a prayer, act of service, or sacrifice) as part of a shared bouquet
    - Use in schools or religious education settings to spark conversation about vocation
    - Leave in church vestibules or adoration chapels for private prayer
    - Display bouquets during parish liturgies or school Masses as a visual symbol of prayerful support for vocations
    - Distribute with the **Vocations Prayer Card** as a companion tool

#### **Grandparents Never Give Up; a Jubilee of Hope**

This year has been designated a Jubilee Year of Hope — and it is also a Jubilee Year (25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary) for the **Catholic Grandparents Association**. As the National Grandparents Pilgrimage to Knock Shrine on 27th July approaches, coinciding with the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, the Church stands at a vital moment in its history.

In an increasingly secularised world where individualism threatens the very fabric of family life, Grandparents have never been more essential. This special day exists because of faithful Irish Grandparents. In 2017, gathered at the holy Shrine of Knock, in Ireland, they began a year of prayer asking Pope Francis to establish a World Day for Grandparents. Not only did he grant their request, but he also included the Elderly. This spiritual legacy, born from Irish Grandparents' prayers and devotion, has now spread worldwide and is honoured in dioceses and parishes everywhere.

Today's Grandparents face challenges unimaginable to previous generations: complex family structures, strained relationships, threats to life at its beginning and end, and a culture that dismisses faith as something of the past. Grandparents know better: faith is a treasure for today and tomorrow, and it is their sacred duty to pass it on.

In this spiritual battle, Grandparents remain God's secret weapon — the quiet, persistent force keeping families anchored in truth, the glue that holds them together when all else falls apart. While others may stand by, Grandparents never do. They love deeply, pray fervently, and hold fast to what others have forgotten: that faith, wisdom, and life's experience are gifts that cannot be replaced by social media or artificial intelligence.

At Knock, they gather to honour Saints Joachim and Anne, the parents of Mary and Grandparents of Jesus. Here they find strength, courage, and confidence in one another's witness and prayers. It is a place where miracles have happened in families and in the Church, emanating from Grandparents' faith.

This pilgrimage is their annual rallying cry — a chance to stand together against the tide of secularism, to renew their promise to pass on the faith, and to shine their light out to the world. This is their day, when they gather together in love, faith, and hope — a living legacy that now reaches parishes and dioceses worldwide. Grandparents never give up hope, and they never will.

Families are encouraged to mark this day not only in the Church but also at home, uniting in prayer and gratitude for all that Grandparents do.

#### <u>Plenary Indulgence</u>

A **Plenary Indulgence** is the complete removal of all **temporal punishment** due for sins that have already been forgiven. It does **not forgive sins** (that happens in Confession), but it removes the **spiritual consequences** or effects of those sins — like a healing of the soul's wounds.

To receive a **Plenary Indulgence**, a person must:

- - Be in a State of Grace
- - Go to Confession
- - Receive Holy Communion
- - Pray for the **Pope's intentions**
- - Be truly repentant and free from sin, even venial sin
- - Do the indulgenced act
  - For Example: performing a 'work of mercy' on a Jubilee year (2025)





#### Jubilee Indulgence: A Special Invitation for Grandparents & the Elderly

#### A Jubilee of Hope and Mercy

The Jubilee Year 2025, called by **Pope Francis** and lovingly carried forward by **Pope Leo XIV**, is a sacred time when the Church invites all the faithful to rediscover God's boundless mercy. A key sign of that mercy is the **Jubilee Indulgence**—a spiritual grace that brings forgiveness of sins and a renewal of hope, both for ourselves and for the souls in Purgatory.

#### What Is a Jubilee Indulgence?

An indulgence is the remission of the temporal consequences of sin, granted by the Church through Christ's saving power. During the Jubilee, this indulgence is offered as a "Jubilee grace," a way to experience God's love more deeply.

#### Actions that Merit the Jubilee Indulgence

Ways to gain the Jubilee Indulgence include:

- Making a pilgrimage to a designated Jubilee site
  - For example: a papal basilica, cathedral, or local shrine
- Participating in Holy Mass, the Rosary, the Via Crucis, or Eucharistic Adoration at a sacred place
- Performing spiritual or corporal works of mercy
  - For example: visiting the elderly, the sick, or prisoners
- · Acts of penance
  - For example: fasting, digital or consumer abstinence, charitable donations

#### **Especially for Grandparents and the Elderly**

In his **2025** Message for the World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly, Pope Leo XIV has called Grandparents and the elderly "the first witnesses of hope." Their faith, experience, and perseverance make them signs of God's ongoing work across generations. In the spirit of the Jubilee, the Church emphasizes that Grandparents and the elderly are not forgotten—they are essential to the Church's life and mission

Even if they cannot make a pilgrimage or attend special events, the Church assures them: you can still fully receive the Jubilee indulgence

#### How?

- - Reciting the Our Father, Creed, and prayers in unity with the Jubilee
- Offering up their daily hardships, illness, or solitude with trust in God
- - Spiritually joining in celebrations, even through television, radio, or online
- - Receiving the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Communion, with help from chaplains, family, or pastoral ministers




#### <u>Jubilee Indulgence: A Special Invitation for Grandparents & the Elderly Continued</u>

#### **Practical Application for Parishes and Communities**

To support World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly and facilitate indulgence participation:

- · Organize celebrations on July 27
- - Ensure access to the Sacraments for homebound individuals
- Promote visits to elderly persons living alone as acts of mercy
- - Distribute sacred images, prayers, or reminders of the Jubilee






